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## General Information

### Bookstore Hours

The Bookstore is located on the lower level of Hoffman Student Union. Bookstore hours are Monday – Friday 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. All required textbooks and supplies may be purchased here. The bookstore also carries a variety of McPherson College clothing and gifts.

### Bookstore Refund Policy

Textbook return is accepted during the return period as posted by the Bookstore. In order to receive a full refund, books must be unmarked and returned with the receipt and a drop/add slip.

### Campus Mailbox

U.S. and campus mail is distributed Monday-Friday. Mailboxes are located in the lower level of the Hoffman Student Union next to the Bookstore. Mailboxes and keys are assigned by the Bookstore staff, and lost keys should be reported to the staff immediately. There is a \$30.00 charge for changing locks and replacing the lost key.

### Food Service

The dining room is open from 7:30 a.m.-7:30 p.m. Sunday-Saturday. Hot items are served from 7:30-9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m., and 5:00-7:30 p.m. Monday-Friday and 11:00 a.m.-1:30 p.m. and 5:00-7:30 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. There is no food service over Thanksgiving, Christmas or Spring Breaks. Proper dress (shirt, shoes) is required in order to be admitted into the dining room. Visitors are welcome to eat in the dining room.

### Health Insurance

Enrollment in the student health insurance plan provided through the College is mandatory for full-time students unless proof of coverage by a substitute plan is presented before registration. Cost: Approx. \$700.00 per year.

### Identification Cards

Students are provided with a photo i.d. card upon arrival. I.d. cards are required for participation in the campus meal plan, and for admission to athletic or student activities events. Replacement cards are available. (ext. 2500)

### Name and/or Address Change

Changes of name and/or address should be reported to the Student Enrollment Services Office to keep records and mailing addresses accurate.

### Students with Disabilities

Efforts are made in every department to inform students and prospective students of the rights of disabled persons under the law and the commitment of McPherson College to non-discrimination toward disabled persons. Students who have either a temporary or permanent

disability are welcome at McPherson College under regular admissions requirements. These students are urged to inform the College of their disability and special needs prior to arrival to allow the College ample time to determine necessary resources and accommodations, including appropriate classroom and housing arrangements. ### **Transcript Request**

Federal law requires that students provide a written request for the release of their transcript. A \$5.00 fee is charged for each official transcript. Transcripts WILL NOT be released for students who have not paid their account in full.

### **Payment of Accounts**

Accounts are due and payable in full on the day of enrollment. For families interested in the monthly payment plans, information on the McPherson College Payment Plan is available in the Business Office. Interest on past due accounts will be charged 1% per month on outstanding balances. **Past due accounts may result in the inability to receive transcripts, prevent future enrollment, and may result in a referral for collection.**

*Please Note:* Books are not included in student charges, and must be purchased separately.

### **Refunds**

Students who are recipients of Title IV funds and who withdraw before completing sixty percent (60%) of the semester will be required to return unearned Title IV funds in accordance with federal regulations. The same refund policy applies to institutional, state, and outside aid. The percentage of the semester that the student completes is determined by dividing the number of days the student attended by the number of days in the semester. Calendar days are used, but breaks of at least 5 calendar days are excluded. Tuition, fees, room, and board charges will be pro-rated at the same rate. No refunds are given after the ninth week of the semester. Bookstore charges, fines, and other personal costs are not pro-rated and are non-refundable. It is possible that a student who withdraws will still have an outstanding balance due.

## Course Information

### Advisor Change

Requests may be made with Student Enrollment Services for a change of advisor.

### Audits, Repeats, Pass/Fail

Students wishing to audit or who are repeating a course must declare this at registration. Students wishing to request pass/fail must do so within the first two weeks of the term. General education courses and courses required for majors are not available for pass/fail.

### Incompletes

Incomplete courses must be finished by mid-term of the following semester. Any change of grade will be reported to the Registrar by the instructor.

### Course Load

The normal student load during Fall and Spring is 12-16 credit hours per semester. The upper limit is 16 hours per semester, except students with a cumulative gpa of 3.0 or better may enroll in 17 hours without special permission.

### Credit by Examination

Credit by Examination can be earned in those courses which are designated for such credit by departments or divisions. Applications are available from Student Enrollment Services.

### Drop/Add

To drop or add a course, the Drop/Add form (available in Student Enrollment Services) must be completed by the student. The student is also responsible for obtaining the necessary signatures and returning the form to the Registrar's office. After the First Week of classes (the third day of Interterm), a \$5.00 fee must be included with the drop/add form before it will be processed. A student may not add a class after the first week of class.

### Meaning of Course Numbers

100-199 primarily for Freshmen

200-299 primarily for Sophomores

300-399 primarily for Juniors

400-499 primarily for Seniors

### Withdrawal

Any drop received after the second week of classes (first week of Interterm), is automatically processed as a withdrawal and will show as such on student reports. The \$5.00 charge will still apply to this procedure.

## Special Courses

**A Course Taken by Appointment** is a course formally offered and listed in the catalog, but may only be taken by appointment if circumstances do not permit a student to take the course when it is formally offered. An application form (signed by the course instructor and the provost/dean of faculty) is due on the first day of the term.

**Independent Study**, ordinarily initiated by the student with the advice of the academic advisor, presumes a special interest which will form the basis for a project in original research. Applicants must have 3.0 grade-point average when they apply. Application is due at registration.

**Career Connections (CC)** is an experienced-based education program designed to provide students with the opportunity to gain hands-on experience in their major fields of study that could not be otherwise obtained in the classroom. This knowledge should, in turn, ease the students' transition from the classroom to the job. Students can choose from two CC options: Field Experience and Internship. To be eligible for the CC program, a student must have (1) completed at least 12 credit hours at McPherson College or hold a junior classification or above, and (2) have a minimum cumulative gpa of 2.0. A maximum of 10 hours of CC can be counted toward graduation requirements. Application to the CC program is due on the first day of class. In consultation with the faculty advisor, the CC coordinator must approve the student's overall plan.

**CC – Field Experience Option** involves observation or participation in vocational and operational activities outside the classroom and in an area usually relevant to the student's major field of study. The student, often participating without pay and for a single term or less, receives college credit for the experience. Permission of the instructor is required. *The Field Experience Option is course numbers 295 and 495 in all departments.*

**CC – Internship Option** is designed to provide students with the opportunity to enhance or gain actual working experience in their major fields of study and the receive college credit for that experience. A wide variety of work situations will be considered as long as the job is relevant to the student's field of study and the student can demonstrate that the experience will make a signification contribution to his/her educational goals. Permission of the instructor is required. *The Internship Option is course number 388 on all departments.*

## Special Programs

### Associated College of Central Kansas (ACCK)

Through the affiliation with ACCK, McPherson College students can benefit from expanded departmental offerings and special programs at any of the other five member colleges participating in the consortium. A library exchange also makes books and periodicals from any of the other colleges available to students.

### International Study Program Opportunities

International study is available to McPherson College students. One of the programs is the Brethren Colleges Abroad (BCA) program. BCA provides a year or semester of study for qualified college students at the following locations: Athens, Greece; Barcelona, Spain; Brussels, Belgium; Cheltenham, England; Dalian, China; Derry, Northern Ireland; Dunedin, New Zealand; Galway, Ireland; Marburg, Germany; Pondicherry, India; Quito, Ecuador; Sapporo, Japan; Strasbourg, France; Sydney, Australia; and Xalapa, Mexico. One semester programs (both Fall and Spring) for juniors and seniors are offered at all the above locations. The programs are open to all majors.

## Student Services

### Campus Ministries

The Director of Campus Ministries directs religious life programming, provides pastoral care and counseling, serves as the sponsor for religious life student groups, and coordinates McPherson College's service learning programs. The Campus Ministries Office is located in Hoffman Student Union. (ext. 2503)

### Career Services

The Career Services Office provides career counseling for students during all phases of career decisions; internships, job search skills, resume writing, interviewing techniques, and other aspects of life planning that are relevant. Further services include assistances in setting up a credential file with references and pertinent materials. (ext. 2436)

### Counseling Services

McPherson College believes that the counseling process is a close adjunct to its educational program. The personal counselor coordinates counseling services in many areas. The counseling office is located in Hoffman Student Union. (ext. 2502)
